How to make a jam sandwich

You will need:

- Bread
- Butter
- Jam
- Knife
- Plate

What to do:

- 1 Wash your hands carefully under the sink with soap.
- 2 Spread the butter with a shiny knife and don't make a hole in the bread.
- 3 Spread the red jam across the bread with a knife and don't make a hole in the bread.
- 4 Pick up the other bread and pat it with your hand.
- 5 Cut the bread and cut it in half in a rectangle or a triangle
