# FYMS

FYMS are thrilled to announce our new fundraising initiative! The Autumn Term School Council were tasked with collating ideas for break time play equipment from the rest of their respective year groups to present to FYMS. We then took away all the incredible suggestions, worked the numbers and logistics and came back with a list of equipment proposals. The children were ecstatic when we told them this week that we can fundraise for some outdoor play equipment such as table tennis bats, skipping ropes and giant connect four as well as a trim trail!

Our fundraising target is £15,000 and we hope to raise £6,000 by the end of the Summer Term 2022 and the remainder by the end of the Summer Term 2023. We also mentioned to the children that should we be able to raise more than this, in the region of £25,000, then we will be able to fund a zip wire as well. You can just imagine their faces! We have asked the School Council to go back to their year groups and share the good news with them as well as come up with ideas for looking after the smaller playground equipment. We look forward to meeting with them again next term to hear their ideas.

We have already raised £2,000 from the events we have held so far, this academic year. The **May Fair** is the largest fundraiser we have until the end of the summer term 2022 and that is where you come in! We are asking each year group to work together as a team to run a stall at the May Fair on Saturday 21st May, 12 noon until 3.00pm. The theme for 2022 is the Queen's 70th Platinum Jubilee. She is also Head of the Commonwealth so there's lot of inspiration out there.

The aim is to put on a stall that is fun and makes a profit! We have an ideas sheet if you're stuck for what to do. We are also asking that Year 5 take on the refreshment tent serving cakes and drinks. We will also be asking Year 6 to manage another stall for us.

### **Cricket Equipment**

Please note that boys and girls do not need to have their own cricket equipment for the cricket season. The school will provide all that is necessary. Many children, however, do like their own equipment and this is up to parents. We do however recommend that, for hygiene reasons, boys have their own cricket boxes which should be clearly named.

The school white polo shirt is required for lessons and can be used for cricket, athletics and tennis. Trainers can be used for cricket matches, but must be mainly white. Proper cricket shoes are ideal but not compulsory. Cricket spikes are not allowed on our astro wicket.

Boys and girls in Year 5 upwards who are playing hard ball cricket must wear the school cricket shirt for matches which is available from the school shop. White cricket trousers are also needed for A and B matches.

Kit for Incrediball cricket for boys and girls will consist of white polo shirt, blue shorts or skorts and white socks.

U8 and U9s (Years 3 and 4) can also wear their white polo shirts and blue shorts for matches.

No club kit is allowed in school matches. School cricket jumpers and cricket hats are also available from the school shop.
