Ask someone if they are intelligent and the response may well be based on their literacy or numeracy skills, or perhaps their general knowledge, but there are many forms of intelligence. Emotional intelligence is a form of social intelligence. Someone who has high emotional intelligence is able to recognise and monitor their own and others' feelings and emotions, to engage with and navigate them, and then to use that emotional information to guide their own thinking and actions.

Every time they interact with someone, they are able to uncover the emotional pieces that are missing from what a person actually says out loud. 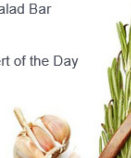

Transition Sessions for Year 4

Wednesday's Moving Up Day gave children from Nursery to Year 3 the opportunity to visit their new classroom and meet their new teachers. Year 4 have also been finding out about what it will be like for them in September. The Head of English, Maths and Science have all led sessions with the children to give them an idea of what it will be like to be taught by subject specialists.

Bruno Santino, Head of Maths, led a fantastic transition session in which he introduced them to some of the types of Maths activities that they will do in Year 5. Particularly popular was the challenge he set them to create a square using several different shapes. Mr Santino was very enthusiastic about how exciting Maths can be and the children are really looking forward to lessons with one of his team.



Head of English, Antonia Robinson, gathered Year 4 in the Woodland Learning Area for a question and answer session about Year 5 English. The children explained what they knew about persuasive language and were taught a clever way of remembering language devices called the A.F.O.R.E.S.T technique. In groups they were tasked to build a new home for 'Jimmy the gnome', using a variety of materials. They then completed a FOR SALE persuasive placard and presented their texts very persuasively to everyone. It was brilliant to see everyone having fun and being creative with their English skills.



Kate Dyason, Head of Science, worked with the children in Year 4 in the Science laboratories this week. The children learnt a little about lab safety and thinking about what types of careers a scientist might have. They were tasked with estimating temperature, mass and time before accurately measuring using the equipment they had available.

It was wonderful to welcome Year 4 into the laboratories and they are destined to have some exciting Science lessons next term in Year 5.
