Individual Photographs

We have now rebooked our school photographer for Tuesday 17th November. He will come into school for just one day to take individual photographs of all the children. He will remain socially distanced from the children and only school staff will help ensure that the children look neat and tidy for their photograph.

We are, unfortunately, unable to offer parents the opportunity to have sibling group photographs this year as it would cause cross bubble movement which is against our risk assessments. We are sorry that we cannot offer this option but are pleased that we have found a way to have the photographs taken safely.

As there is only one day for the photographs to be taken and because we need to organise the schedule around the bubble groups it would be appreciated if you do not make routine medical or dental appointments for your child on this day. Thank you.

Due to complications caused by the current restrictions our photographer has altered the way that photographs are ordered. There will be on-line ordering only. The new method means that we are no longer able to have the school logo on photographs but it also means that parents will have more pack options from which to select and also that they can mix and match photos within a pack.

Winter Uniform Reminder

Parents are reminded that all pupils should be in winter uniform for the second half of the Autumn Term and throughout the Spring Term.

- Girls' uniform for children up to Year 6
 is the school kilt (or school pinafore for
 Year 1, Reception, and Nursery girls),
 white shirt, school tie and grey pullover
 with plain grey socks or tights and
 black shoes.
- Boys' uniform for children up to Year 6 is grey trousers or shorts, white shirt, school tie and grey pullover with plain grey socks and black shoes.
- Variations apply to the Nursery and Reception, senior school pupils and prefects.
- All pupils should look smart and tidy. Please also remember to clearly name all uniform so that it can be returned to the owner if it gets lost. It is impossible to reunite unnamed items of uniform with their owner.

Year 5 Homework

As mentioned in INAMOS at the start of term the homework schedule for Year 5 is being introduced in phases to help with the transition from Year 4 to Year 5.

After half term French homework will be set to be completed on Monday evenings and Science to be completed over the weekend. This is on top of English which is currently set for Tuesday and Maths which is set for Thursday evenings. There is no homework set for Wednesday evenings.

We hope that this phased homework helped pupils start to acquire the homework habit, which is essential in developing individual learning skills.

Half Term Holiday Club and Extended Nursery Provision

The Yateley Manor Holiday Club and Extended Nursery Provision will both be open during half term. There is still time to book your child in for the second week: Monday 26th October to Friday 30th October.

The Nursery Provision is for Nursery aged children and the Holiday Club is open to children from Reception upwards.

Boys Sports After Half Term

With the cancellation of football fixtures due to Covid we are able to increase the range of sport we offer in sports lessons. After half term all boys from Years 3 to 8 will be doing hockey and in order to play hockey safely boys will need to bring a gum shield/mouth guard for these lessons. If they do not have a mouth guard they will **not** be able to play for health and safety reasons.

Mouths guards are available in the school shop as well as other sports retailers. Please make sure your son has a well fitted, comfortable mouth guard on his return to school after half term.

Rugby starts in lessons for boys towards the end of November. Under the laws of the game, all players **must** wear approved footwear which includes boots fitted with rugby safety studs, moulded blades or blades (except Adidas metal tipped blades). Removable rugby safety studs are obtainable from the school shop (50p each or £5.50 for a bag of 12) and all good sports shops.

It is recommended by the RFU that mouth guards be worn as well. Children without a gum shield will **not** be able to represent the school in any teams and will only have limited access to elements of training sessions. Therefore all boys from Year 3 upwards should have a gum shield. **NB** Boys in Years 1, 2 and 3 do not need rugby studs or gumshields for rugby (although, as mentioned above, the Year 3 boys will need the gumshield for hockey) as they will be playing tag rugby.
