Robert Upton's latest blog can be found on the School website. The following is a taster:

In 1623, William Shakespeare wrote, "One man in his time plays many parts, his acts being seven ages, from screaming infant to the finality of oblivion." Three hundred years later, the American psychoanalyst Erik Erikson offered a more modern take on psychological transformation, examining and mapping the personal development of humans throughout their lifetime.



Erikson produced what has become known as the most popular and influential theory of human development. His model included 8 stages of psychosocial growth, where each stage – influenced by biological, psychological, and social factors – was sequential, from birth to infancy, childhood into adulthood, and finally middle age into old age.

The children have already taken part in a First Aid course and have an exciting Navy Day, a French Day and a Grafitti Workshop to look forward to. In between they will be writing stories for the Pre-Prep children (see article on the right of this page).

A fun games and pizza evening and, last year's firm favourite, the Boat Race Challenge, complete the programme.

The Post Common Entrance programme is the culmination of Year 8s' time at Yateley Manor and complements their hard work academically and within the School community. We look forward to celebrating all that they have achieved at our end of term Speech Day.

The Bash

After an absence of almost three years, the final Wednesday of term will see the long awaited return of Yateley Manor's very popular Big Bash

Prep children organise themselves into small groups and come up with an idea for a game or a stall. It is up to them to collect together everything they need and make sure that they bring it all into school on the day. The children are given time in the morning to set up their stalls on the fields, if the weather is favourable, or in the Fyson Blum Hall before the event in the afternoon. All games stalls will have reasonable prices. Although the emphasis is on fun, all money raised will go to this year's school charity, First Days Children's Charity. We anticipate a fun packed afternoon and the children are already busy organising their activities.

We very much hope that parents will support children in their ventures and allow them some spending power on the day. Children from Years 1 and 2 are also invited to join in the fun in the afternoon. They may bring in small change (maximum of £5) in a named envelope to be handed to their form teacher at the start of the day. Envelopes will be returned to the children in the afternoon before the start of the Bash.

Children should come to school in their normal uniform and bring their hat with them for the afternoon.

The Big Bash is always very popular with the children and we would like to thank all families for their support.

School Shop and Uniform for September 2022

After half term, the school shop will only be open for general business on Wednesdays between 3.00pm and 5.30pm except for Wednesday 15th June when it will be closed. Tuesday opening times will be used for Year 2 to Year 3 and new pupil kit outs.

Nursery moving to Reception: Children moving from Nursery to Reception will only require minor additions to their current uniform. Please visit the shop during normal shop opening hours (Wednesdays only after half term) to purchase any additional uniform. A booklet detailing the Pre-Prep uniform requirements will be sent home to current Nursery parents in the coming weeks.

Year 2 moving to Year 3: Fittings for children moving from Year 2 to Year 3 in September 2022 have already started. Please contact Jo or PJ in School Reception to make a Tuesday afternoon kit out appointment. Appointments will take approximately 30 minutes per child. A uniform booklet and price list, detailing the children's uniform requirements for Year 3, has been sent home to all Year 2 parents.

Year 6 moving to Year 7: Children moving to Year 7 have a small uniform change. Black jumpers can be ordered using the uniform order form, <u>available on our website</u>, or from School Reception or you may email <u>Laura Bretherton</u> with your order.

Girls moving to Year 7 will also need to place an order for black skirts, before the middle of June. Please feel free to visit the shop one Wednesday afternoon for your daughter to be measured, or leave the required skirt size details at the School Reception desk. Please refer any queries regarding uniform to Laura Bretherton in the shop on 01252 405505 or email shop@yateleymanor.com. Please note that payment can be made by credit or debit card (other than Amex and Apple Pay). We are unable to accept contactless payment.

Sun Safety

We are hoping for some sunny weather in the next couple of weeks. During sunny weather we strongly recommend that all pupils take measures to protect themselves against exposure to the strong rays of the sun.

Hats should be worn for sport or play and a good spread of colourless sun cream should be applied **before** the children come to school. We recommend that a twelve or eight hour variety is used to reduce the amount of topping up that is needed.

Please note that some of the Nivea Sun Children's Products range contain almond oil. Please exercise caution in this respect as we continue to be a nut-free school due to the number of children with nut allergies. Please see image for details.



Children can bring their own sunscreen

(hypoallergenic and at least factor 30) to school in a named bottle which, for Pre-Prep and Prep children, should be kept in their PE bags.

Parents of Nursery children should hand them to a member of the Nursery staff.

While members of staff will remind children to reapply sunscreen during the day, they cannot be asked to apply sunscreen to Pre-Prep or Prep pupils. The school shop stocks a variety of hats.

Please note that pupils will not be allowed in to school wearing the brightly coloured zinc sun cream favoured by cricketers!

Prep Sports Day - Friday 17th June - 10.15am

We are looking forward to welcoming parents to join us for Prep Sports Day.

Children in Years 3 to 8 do not need to be in school until 9.50am when they must register with their tutors in the Fyson Blum Hall. Children should arrive in their PE kit ready for the day and those in Years 4, 5, 6, 7 & 8 all need to bring their swimming kit too. School opens for supervision from 8.00am with morning coaches running at the usual time if you prefer your children to come in as normal. Events get under way at 10.15am.

Please note that there will be <u>no after school clubs for Prep children on this day</u> although there will be supervision of children whose parents are not able to attend Sports Day until 6.30pm. Clubs will run as usual for Pre-Prep and coaches will run as usual.

There are six different main events and each year group can participate in at least 4 during the day. The other events will have been completed before Sports Day (see page 4 for details).

- 1. 300m/600m: Optional for any child in Years 3, 4 and 5 who would like to run 300m or Years 6, 7 or 8 who would like to run 600m.
- 2. <u>Inter House Tug Of War.</u> Everyone will take part in the house competition.
- 3. Individual Sprint Races. All pupils will be seeded to ensure that pupils of similar speeds compete against each other.
- 4. <u>Inter House Swimming Gala</u>. An exciting and enjoyable event in which all the children take part.
- 5. <u>Inter House Shuttle Relays.</u> All girls and boys in the year group will be mixed at random in straight house shuttle relays.
- 6. <u>Athletics</u>: high jump, long jump, throwing or hurdles.

The final event of the day will be inter house running relays around the track. Each event will consist of four children from each house competing against the other houses. This will bring the day to an exciting climax.

At the end of the day all the individual and team results will be added together and a House Athletics Cup presented to the winning House. There will also be a House Tug of War Shield, a House Swimming Shield and a Shuttle Relay Cup.

This is a lovely informal day (weather permitting) and most people picnic with their children on the lawn, although we are happy to provide a lunch for those children whose parents are unable to attend. Please let your child's form tutor know by Monday 13th June if this is necessary. If the day is very warm, children should wear suitable hats and protective sun cream.

We want this to be a family day and your children will spend a lot of it with you when not in events. Please be aware that when they are with you they are your responsibility and when they are with us they are ours. Please listen for announcements and encourage your child to be at his or her next event five minutes before it is due to start.

Sports Kit required for Sports Day: White trainers, white socks, blue shorts/skort, house polo shirt, Yateley Manor track suit top for tug of war (not Year 6) Yateley Manor swimming kit including house coloured hats for girls, and goggles for everyone (swimming kit not needed for Year 3), sun hat and sun screen.

Parking: A reminder that there is no access to the school grounds before 8.00am on any school day.

- A large section of the front car park will be cordoned off to ensure that Pre-Prep parents can safely drop and collect their children. Parking in this car park will be very limited for parents attending Sports Day.
- There will be plenty of parking on the school fields. Parents should use the rear entrance of the school in Stilwell Close for which the postcode is GU46 6XH. Once you have arrived in Stilwell Close there is a narrow lane on the left which you should take. The School gates will be opened at 8.00am and our Maintenance team will be on hand to guide you. Please do not arrive before this time as we do not want to inconvenience our neighbours who live on this road.

Please only set up your chairs and picnic rugs outside the track and behind the barrier rope/line.

The sprint races use photo finish technology so please do not stand directly in line with the finish line.
