# This Week's Matches

Our U13 and U11 basketball teams saw action for the first time this term in two excellent matches against Lambrook. Despite the fact that there were six debutants in the U11 squad and that they soon found themselves 0 - 6 down, the team worked reallly hard and finished with a very creditable win. With Year 7 away in France, the U13 team were short of players but also managed to secure an excellent victory.

On Wednesday we hosted eight schools at the annual Yatelely Manor U11 hockey tournament in which our U11A team played. It was a great afternoon of hockey enjoyed by everyone who took part. Our team played well and were unlucky not to reach the final four.

The senior and U10 girls played matches against Edgeborough. The senior team, depleted by Year 7 being away, faced two equal Edgeborough teams. Although the girls worked really hard they were narrowly beaten by both. The U10s had a mixed afternoon with the A team securing a good win and the B team a narrow loss.

This week our boys played in triangular matches against Hall Grove and Crosfields. # **Bradfield Science Challenge**

Four of our Year 5 scientists embarked on an afternoon of science challenges at Bradfield College. They examined plant cells, counted maggots, made loud speakers

and carried out several chemical tests alongside children from 30 other schools. It was wonderful to watch their collaboration and commitment to each other throughout the afternoon and to hear them receive much praise from the Bradfield teachers for their scientific approach to each task.

At the end of the day, the children were wowed by some exciting demonstrations of chemistry.
